
Sustainable fisheries management and biodiversity conservation of deep-sea living resources and ecosystems in the ABNJ

### **Component 4: Area-based planning in ABNJ**

Over 60 percent of the world's oceans lie in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction (ABNJ), and contain a diversity of living and non-living resources that support human well-being. With technological developments that allow increased access to these resources, collective efforts are required to ensure that ecosystems are protected and that the resource use is sustainable.



UN Environment (UNEP), UN-FAO and UNEP-WCMC are collectively working to support development, management and sustainability of deep-sea fisheries and biodiversity conservation in ABNJ. Specifically, UNEP-WCMC is testing and developing area-based planning in ABNJ. A series of reports have been produced to support understanding in this place. These reports have a specific focus on the two pilot regions for the project - the Western Indian Ocean and the South East Pacific - however, they are of relevance to other regional seas.


