





The Endangered Wildlife Trust is committed to supporting and implementing the GEF project entitled "*Enhancing the Conservation Effectiveness of Seagrass Ecosystems Supporting Globally Significant Populations of Dugong across the Indian and Pacific Oceans Basins*", which is being submitted to GEF by UNEP/CMS Dugong MoU Secretariat, for implementation over a five year period *if funding is received*.


